

Filling the Gaps Report:

We just launched our first report of 2024!

Filling the Gaps – Evictions and Government Policy in Vancouver During COVID-19 explores eviction filing data from 2010-2022. This report examines the extent to which government programs implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic were successful in protecting tenants' from displacement amidst a housing crisis and public health emergency. The analysis draws on eviction, census, and COVID-19 data, in the Metro Vancouver area, as well as government programs and tribunal decisions, to assess how effective governments were at stopping evictions and displacement. We look at this data to consider whether and how governments filled the gap of affordable housing during the pandemic.

First United Law Reform:

First United just launched their Residential Tenancy Act Law Reform Platform, aimed at easing housing burdens for vulnerable households across British Columbia. This comprehensive platform offers evidence-based recommendations grounded in thorough research, statistical analysis, case law, and legislation from various Canadian jurisdictions. Drawing insights from datasets such as the Residential Tenancy Branch and the BC Eviction Mapping dataset, this platform seeks to enact meaningful change within the Residential Tenancy Act.

Tara Fernando has been the Knowledge Communications Coordinator for BSH since May 2022. Her final day at BSH will be on March 15th before she embarks on some travels!


